The workshop is being held at the Maysville Community College in Fields Auditorium from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

The workshop is for professionals, parents, grandparents, or family members who are interested in coping with children's challenging behavior. The workshop has been approved for six Certified Professional Counselor hours and six Professional Development Training hours.

The presenter, Ruth Herman Wells, M.S., has developed attention-grabbing solutions to stop or manage youth violence, school failure, truancy, dropping out,

family problems, poor motivation Asperger behaviors, apathy, bad attitudes, attachment disorder ADHD, depression, withdrawal peer conflict, classroom misbehavior, independent living, anger control problems, delinquency, severe emotional problems, and even "girl's problems" like teen pregnancy. Wells' lively, surprising workshop has been featured on cable TV's *Mind Extension University* and offered at dozens of conferences, schools and agencies. She is the author of 17 books and has written for *The Child Welfare Report*, and managed model youth programs.
